PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Carlinville Police Department, in central Illinois, needed more space for operating their department. Chief Dave Haley had been planning an upgrade for years and the city was now able to purchase a 6,800 sq ft building that transformed into a new state-of-the-art Police Department, emergency management, and public services facility. The facility includes a secure lobby, Carlinville Emergency Management Agency (CEMA), administrative offices, police dispatch room, a processing room, holding rooms, and an evidence room.

The approval of a state grant for \$250,000 through the Rebuild Illinois capital program as a buyer's grant, allowed the city of Carlinville to more than double the size of its police building and add new services.

PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

Veregy renovated both the exterior and interior of the purchased building for a fully operational and expanded police, emergency, and public facility that is ADA compliant:

- Exterior changes include new sidewalks, parking, and landscaping
- Building exterior includes window reworking, new windows, painting, roof repairs
- Complete interior gutting, then adding new electrical, HVAC, and plumbing
- Interior redesign includes state-of-the-art equipment and security
- All new ceilings, floors, walls, casework, countertops
- New secure lobby, public assistance office, and training/emergency/community room
- · New administrative offices, dispatch room, child-safe room, roll call room
- New locker rooms for men and women, bathrooms, break room
- New police processing room, interview and holding rooms, evidence holding, sally port (a secure entrance for secure transfer of suspects)
- Fire alarm system meets NFPA code, smoke/heat detectors, sprinklers/horn strobes
